### **Regatta Fleet SUPPLEMENTARY SAILING INSTRUCTIONS (SSIs)**

#### **1. RULES**

- 1.1 These Supplementary Sailing Instructions (SSIs) are to be read in conjunction with the current (latest revision) IODAI Major Event Sailing Instructions (SIs). If there is a conflict between the Notice of Race or MESI and these SSIs, these SSIs shall prevail.

#### **2. COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS**

- 2.1 The official notice board will be the IODAI fleet Whatsapp groups.
- 2.2 The race office is located at XXXX.
- 2.3 On the water, the race committee intends to monitor and communicate on VHF radio channel XXX.
- 2.4 A briefing for Racing Regatta Fleet sailors will be held at 10:15am on Saturday morning and at 10:00am on Sunday at xxxx.
- 2.5 A briefing for support boat crews will be held at 9:30 at xxx.

#### **3. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE**

- 3.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed at the [main flagpole in front of the clubhouse]

#### **4. SCHEDULE**

- 4.2 The racing schedule will be as set out above, however the Race Committee may get one race ahead of schedule but shall not sail

more than 4 races on any one day. A maximum number of 6 races in the series will be sailed

## **5. RACING AREA**

6.1 The course race marks will be [large black inflatable marks], an inflatable red mark for the pin end and the finish mark will be a dan buoy with a flag

## **7. OBSTRUCTIONS/RESTRICTIONS**

7.1 There are no designated obstructions in the Race Area.

## **8. THE START**

8.1 The start line will be between a red and white staff on the committee vessel displaying an orange flag at the starboard end and a red inflatable mark at the port end of the line

## **9. THE FINISH**

9.1 The finishing line is between a staff displaying a blue flag on the finishing boat at the starboard end and the course side of the port end finishing mark.

## **10. THE COURSE**

10.1 The course may be either a windward-leeward or triangular course. The diagrams in Appendix A show the courses, including the approximate angles between legs, the order in which the marks are to be passed and the side on which mark is to be left.

- 10.2 The course to be sailed will be indicated on a board displayed on the starboard side of the Committee Vessel. The course will be displayed no later than the preparatory signal. This changes RRS 27.1

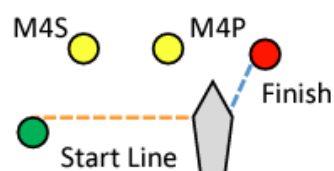
### Windward Leeward Course
