1. GENERAL INFORMATION



The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the company's financial statements.

Basis of preparation The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis and in accordance with the association concorrents. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is the Companies Act 2014 and FRS 105 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable to the Micro-Entries Regimin" stated by the Financial Reporting Countil.

The company qualifies as a micro company as defined by section 280D of the Companies Act 2014 in respect of the financial year, and has applied the rules of the Micro Companies Regime! In accordance with section 280E of the Companies Act 2014 and FRS 105.

mcome Turnover comprises the invoice value of goods supplied by the company, exclusive of trade discounts and value added tax.

Stocks Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net melaside value. Stocks are distermined on a first-in find-out basis. Cost comprises expenditors incurred in the normal ocupae of business in bringing stocks to there reserved tocktor and considion. Tail provision is made for undersite and some moving frams. 
